Leader: Glory to God in the highest.
All: And peace to God's people on earth.

Scripture Reading (Luke 2)

Prayer of Blessing (said by leader or all together)

who was born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem.

and surround you with the warmth of our love,
as did the animals of the stable.

Scripture Reading:

First Sunday of Advent (Isaiah 9)

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness – on them light has shone. For a child has been born to us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Second Sunday of Advent (Isaiah 11)

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.

Third Sunday of Advent (Isaiah 35)

They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God. Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like the deer and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy.

Fourth Sunday of Advent (Isaiah 7)

The prophet Isaiah said: “Hear then, O house of David! The Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel.”

Lighting of the Candle

O God, as light comes from this candle (these candles), may the blessing of Jesus Christ come to us, warming our hearts and brightening our way. May Christ our Saviour bring life into the darkness of this world, and to us, as we wait for his birth. Amen.

we praise you for sending Jesus, your Son,
to save us from our sins

Blessing of a Christmas Tree

Leader: Glory to God in the highest.
All: And peace to God's people on earth.

Scripture Reading (Luke 2)

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told to them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen.

Prayer of Blessing (said by leader or all together)

All glory and praise to you, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
