## The Decades

The first healing mystery: Jesus restores the outcast to community.

On the way to Jerusalem, as Jesus entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. (Luke 17.11-15)

They were lumped together as "unclean". No one knows what afflictions they suffered. These lepers could not be touched; they were thrust from home, family and community, and were forced to live apart. Whatever infected them could not have been worse than the isolation and loneliness they experienced.

Jesus, restore our communities to health and wholeness. Help us to remain grateful for the privilege to gather together.

The second healing mystery: Jesus rewards the woman of courage.

Suddenly a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak, for she said to herself, "If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well." Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well." (Matthew 9.20-22)

She was not supposed to be out in public, touching a man's clothing, or causing a stir that would embarrass her family. But the woman suffered too much for too long to behave by social norms that could not help or save her. She trusted in the power of Jesus to save.

Jesus, bless the courageous ones who will not sit by and suffer quietly without taking the necessary steps to find help.

The third healing mystery: Jesus rescues the child in danger.

A man knelt before him, and said, "Lord, have mercy on my son, for he suffers terribly; he often falls into the fire and into the water." Jesus answered, "Bring him here to me." (Matthew 17.14-17)

This poor child fell often in fire and water. He reminds us of all children who suffer the effects of conditions they did nothing to cause and are powerless to change.

For all the ways in which children suffer – hunger, abuse, impaired learning conditions, fear, anxiety, shame – Lord, rescue them and

restore their hope for a brighter future.

The fourth healing mystery:

Jesus heals the person suffering emotional and mental distress.

Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit, and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God. But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" (Mark 1.23-25)

Demons haunt us all. But some, like this man who cried out to Jesus, are especially burdened. People who are vulnerable, whose health are compromised, suffer exceptionally from stress, upheaval and isolation.

Lord, we ask you to keep the vulnerable in your special care. Hold them in the palm of your hand and let them feel your constant protection.

The fifth healing mystery: Jesus heals the earth's abundance.

Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "You have no fish, have you? They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. (John 21.4-6)

Behind the realities of human suffering looms the greater danger of

a world enduring the cumulating effects of exploitation, greed, indifference and ignorance. How we care for our common home affects our living conditions and relationships. Christian charity moves us to care for each other by caring for creation.

Lord, creation is your gift to us. Give us the wisdom and the will to be stewards and not merely consumers of your gifts, and renew the face of the earth.

#### Apostles' Creed
